A woman of faith and determination to make a difference, Mrs. Carolyn C. Parker Scantlebury entered her Heavenly home on January 12, 2023. Her love and everlasting presence will remain a legacy.

Carolyn C. Parker-Scantlebury was a native Houstonian and a graduate of Jack Yates High School, Huston-Tillotson College (now University), Atlanta University and Yale University ~ specialty practicum in Psychiatric Social Work. Human Services and the elevation of our people was her heart and greatest passion. Her Motto was, "Find a Way or Make One". Carolyn was the first child born to Clarence Parker & Virttie Jacks Parker in Houston, Texas at St. Elizabeth Hospital.

Carolyn for many years worked as a psychiatric social worker for HISD and was a parent advocate for many students and families. She was President Emeritus of the Houston Chapter of the N.A.A.C.P., devoted member of Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority Incorporated and was a member of the Windsor Village Church Family where she faithfully served on the Administrative and New Membership boards and in other capacities at the church for over 35 years.

As we were walking to our cars. Something in my spirit told me this would be my last time seeing you alive. You said "I want to be there for his birthday" Something in my spirit told me you knew this might be the last birthday celebration. I praise God that you are at peace. We may not have been biological sisters but we were kindred spirits. In reading some of the Facebook posts. There were so many that you encouraged and they had a special place in your heart. Not just me and mine (oh how Nathaniel loved his Auntie Carolyn). You and he had a special bond. I remember the time; we lived in the same complex and we had a falling out and you came and knocked at my door and said Donnie "miss his NaNa". Nathaniel was almost 2/3 at the time. From that point forward. We were the best of friends. You and Donnie always included, Nathaniel. You were always everyone's #1 cheerleader; 100% loyal/supportive. Sometimes to a fault, and that was good as well. With all of the love you gave to others. Your love for your family (Donnie, Noah, Asa, and Ava Camille) is insurmountable!!!! They are truly blessed to have you as a mother and grandmother. Your homegoing celebration was absolutely beautiful. I was invited to the wedding ,but not the reception. Their guest lista was just too long. I was okay with going home. The ceremony was beautiful and I was happy. Besides my 4 inch heels were killing me! But Carolyn as a member of the Executive Committee at Windsor Village was invited to both! She insisted I accompany her to the reception. So as we arrived,Carolyn said," Just walk fas like you are in a hurry and nobody will stop you. Besides,you are dressed up in your "Needless Markup" (Neiman Marcus) outfit. Everybody will assume you are important!" About 20 minutes later ,I was sitting on the couch with Pastore Suzettes's mother chatting up a storm and rubbing our aching feet! Over the years Carolyn literally dragged me to countless events. Everybody know I dont like meetings of any kind. I will work. I just dont want to talk or meet about it. So Carolyn would just call me for various volunteer events,and I showed up! She even had me campaigning for Rep. Sheila Jackson Lee on the Northside. I visited several churches one Sunday on the Representatives behalf! Carolyn said I had a gift for gab and could sell ice to an Eskimo! So I went and was a hit. Carolyn and I traveled to the Chicago Gospel Festival to see Walt Whitman choir perform. There were 4 of us including my daughter and Joyce Pellrin,teacher from Lamar High School. We were only there for the weekend but we had enough luggage for a month. When our rental car came,they had to send it back for a bigger car. And still everyone had luggage in their lap except me because I was driving! We had a blast! However it got hot that afternoon. Our hair was drooping and we were sweating. I was at the concession stand drinking anything they had. We returned to our hotel room and took a nap. We woke up,got cute again and ended a great night at the festival. Walt Whitman was so much fun!I have a book worth of stories about escapdes with Carolyn. But some things nobody needs to know except the two of us! Just know that Carolyn lived her life with her foot on the pedal! Rest for now my friend. I will see you later but for right now,I have assignments to finish. Keep whispering in my ear. I hear you!

Once she saw my food tray she said,"I am going to 3rd Ward and get you some food." Our friendship was born at the altar of prayer and prayer sustained us. Her illness was a blow I have not recovered from. I saw her as invincible. She was my source of strength. She knew my heart and my mind. My life will forever be changed by her death. 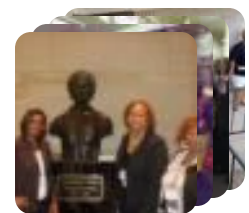

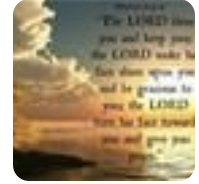

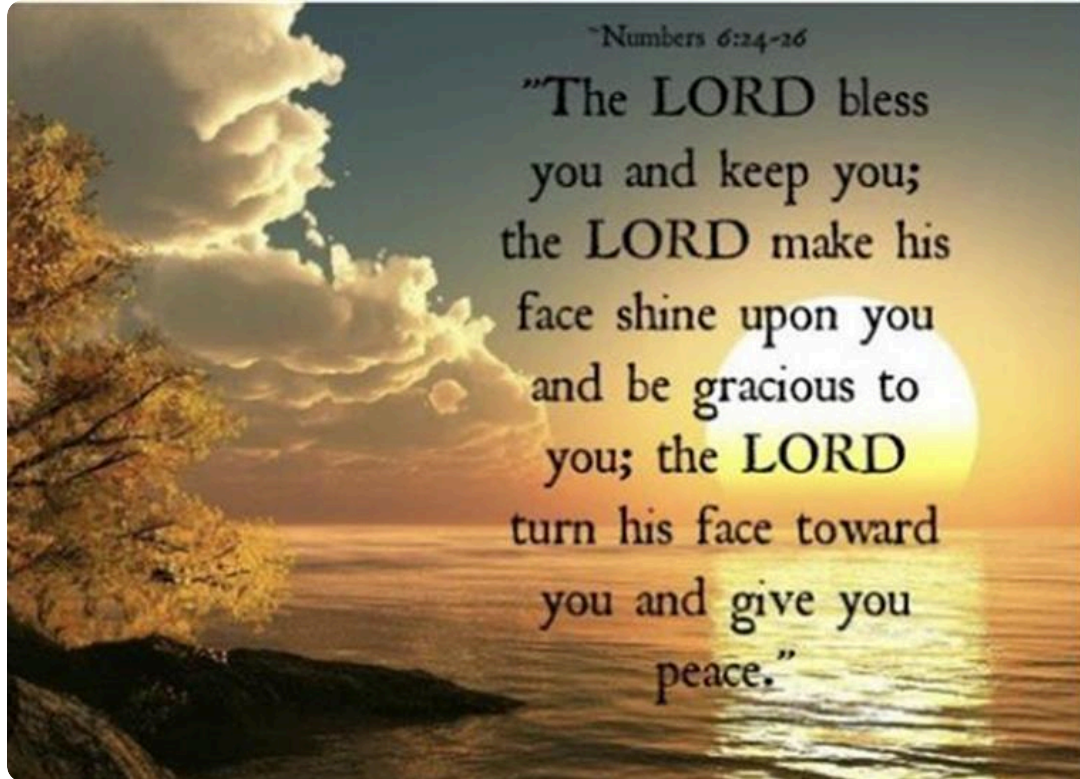
