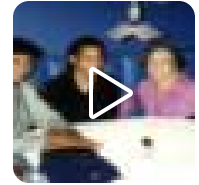

The Community Artists' Collective(CAC) is a 501(c)(3) community-based organization. Since 1987, CAC has worked to lead change through the arts. The mission of the Collective is to provide the educational and cultural link among African American artists and all communities, to inspire unlimited creativity. The CAC's vision is to serve as a bastion for cross-cultural artistic appreciation, artistic empowerment and accessibility to the arts by fostering racial and ideological inclusivity among Houston's local art community. The CAC operates as a catalyst providing both inspirational and educational sources for artists and citizens so that they can use their talents and creative abilities to address and solve economic, cultural and social challenges in the natural and built environments in which we live, work and serve.

The Ensemble Theatre was founded in 1976 by the late George Hawkins to preserve African American artistic expression and enlighten, entertain and enrich a diverse community. Decades later, the theatre has evolved from a touring company operating from the trunk of Mr. Hawkins' car to being one of Houston's finest historical cultural institutions. The Ensemble is one of the only professional theatres in the region dedicated to the production of works portraying the African American experience, the oldest and largest professional African American theatre in the Southwest, and holds the distinction of being one of the nation's largest African American theatres owning and operating its facility and producing in-house.
